From the Pastor: First Holy Communion!

This weekend we have 30 children receiving their First Holy Communion. Before they were admitted to the altar rail, they had to study quite a lot. They needed to memorize (I know, that is a four-letter word today in most religious education programs!) the basic Catholic prayers and be able to explain Who they receive in Holy Communion and how they know it to be truly the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ rather than just a symbol of Him. There is just one part of the test that I forgot to quiz them on. They were supposed to recite the 11 Canons of the Council of Trent regarding the Eucharist. I have to assume that they would have been able to do so since they aced the rest of the test. When is the last time you looked over these important teachings on what CANNOT be believed, stated, or denied without being in grave error?

CANONS

CANON I.-If any one denieth, that, in the sacrament of the most holy Eucharist, are contained truly, really, and substantially, the body and blood together with the soul and divinity of our Lord Jesus Christ, and consequently the whole Christ; but saith that He is only therein as in a sign, or in figure, or virtue; let him be anathema.

CANON II.-If any one saith, that, in the sacred and holy sacrament of the Eucharist, the substance of the bread and wine remains conjointly with the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ, and denieth that wonderful and singular conversion of the whole substance of the bread into the Body, and of the whole substance of the wine into the Blood-the species Only of the bread and wine remaining-which conversion indeed the Catholic Church most aptly calls Transubstantiation; let him be anathema.

CANON III.-If any one denieth, that, in the venerable sacrament of the Eucharist, the whole Christ is contained under each species, and under every part of each species, when separated; let him be anathema.

CANON IV.-If any one saith, that, after the consecration is completed, the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ are not in the admirable sacrament of the Eucharist, but (are there) only during the use, whilst it is being taken, and not either before or after; and that, in the hosts, or consecrated particles, which are reserved or which remain after communion, the true Body of the Lord remaineth not; let him be anathema.

CANON V.-If any one saith, either that the principal fruit of the most holy Eucharist is the remission of sins, or, that other effects do not result therefrom; let him be anathema.

CANON VI.-If any one saith, that, in the holy sacrament of the Eucharist, Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, is not to be adored with the worship, even external of latria; and is, consequently, neither to be venerated with a special festive solemnity, nor to be solemnly borne about in processions, according to the laudable and universal rite and custom of holy church; or, is not to be proposed publicly to the people to be adored, and that the adorers thereof are idolators; let him be anathema.

CANON VII.-If any one saith, that it is not lawful for the sacred Eucharist to be reserved in the sacrarium [tabernacle], but that, immediately after consecration, it must necessarily be distributed amongst those present; or, that it is not lawful that it be carried with honour to the sick; let him be anathema.

CANON VIII.-If any one saith, that Christ, given in the Eucharist, is eaten spiritually only, and not also sacramentally and really; let him be anathema.

CANON IX.-If any one denieth, that all and each of Christ's faithful of both sexes are bound, when they have attained to years of discretion, to communicate every year, at least at Easter, in accordance with the precept of holy Mother Church; let him be anathema.

CANON X.-If any one saith, that it is not lawful for the celebrating priest to communicate himself; let him be anathema.

CANON XI.-If any one saith, that faith alone is a sufficient preparation for receiving the sacrament of the most holy Eucharist; let him be anathema. And for fear lest so great a sacrament may be received unworthily, and so unto death and condemnation, this holy Synod ordains and declares, that sacramental confession, when a confessor may be had, is of necessity to be made beforehand, by those whose conscience is burthened with mortal sin, how contrite even soever they may think themselves. But if any one shall presume to teach, preach, or obstinately to assert, or even in public disputation to defend the contrary, he shall be thereupon excommunicated.

In reality, the children did indeed have to know most of these canons even though they were not learned or recited so formally. It is sad that most adults, both Catholic and Protestant, do not believe what our youngsters already know to be True.

Catholic Enrichment Week is coming up and the theme is American Saints!

Mrs. Deborah Owens is coming back with her amazing lectures! The games, crafts, movies, and lectures are all catered to enrich your child's understanding of the rich treasure of our Catholic Faith. <u>Sign-ups start May 12th and end June 17th</u>. This year we only have 8 Safe Environment Trained volunteers signed up. This means we will only be accepting 40 kids to CEW this year, ages 8-18. The price of camp is \$15 per child for the week, or \$60 for a family of 5 or more. Price includes pizza and t-shirt on the last day!

In years past we have had over one hundred kids at CEW with around 10 to 12 volunteers who came every day, and to help we required each parent to sign up to help chaperone at least one day out of the week. We also allowed kids ages 5-7 to come to CEW and we had special volunteers to solely be with those kids since they need more attention than the older kids. By the end of the week, the volunteers who committed to being at CEW every day were burned out, but they made it work and it is always rewarding.

This year the Safe Environment requirements were clarified for the CEW team. No adult without safe environment training and fingerprints is to be volunteering or chaperoning at a Youth Ministry Event or Camp. Also, the medical form required for the camp must be notarized and turned in a couple of weeks before the event for the office and Diocese's processing.

To put on CEW we need more volunteers who can work the camp from 9 am—3 pm and the parents to continue to sign up for at least one day of the week. So Fr. Palka has agreed to reimburse for the cost of Safe Environment and Fingerprints. Also, Mrs. Whiskeyman has offered to set a Sunday aside to notarize everyone's medical forms for free on a date to be announced before the deadline. We hope you sign up your child to attend CEW American Saints this July! Right now we can only accept 40 children, but we hope to get more committed volunteers to work the week so we can open it up to more kids!
